## Reflections

When I consider your heavens,  
the work of your fingers. Ps. 8:3

I have a picture on my study wall that is a print of an original painting by a lady who still lives in Steeple, and still paints wonderful pictures. The print on the study wall shows the church of St. Lawrence and All Saints Steeple from the perspective of sitting in a field opposite the church, and the picture takes you by a path to the front door. I like pictures that you can 'lose yourself' in, by that I mean that one can imagine walking the path in the picture, in this case to the church but it could be beside the water or across a heather hill, you find yourself imagining that walk.

I have great admiration for artists (I couldn't paint the side of a house!); but good artists capture life in their pictures and share those insights with the observer. What a gift! When we have good pictures on the wall to look at it doesn't matter if it is raining outside or overcast we can see what a beautiful world we have in pictures and we can lose ourselves in them. The colours the elements and the subject of the picture give texture and feeling for the onlooker and capture moments of time. It takes a little while to look at the picture and take in all the work and the detail that has been placed on the canvas for us to find, and delight in. What craftsmanship and skill there is in a painting.

On a walk with the dog recently along the sea wall in Burnham, walking towards Creeksea, we looked at the sun setting in the west, the pink clouds changing colour by the minute and the sparkle on the water lapping up to the shore.

We heard the skylarks singing and watched the Egrets taking off and flying around to land on the water's edge once more. We saw the fields waiting to be harvested and the Horse Chestnut trees just starting to change colour. Blackberry bushes starting to come to show their fruit along with Rosehip and Sloes. So much colour and life, right on our doorstep!

Sometimes we march through daily life determined to get the next thing done – finish the job, get home to enjoy a rest; but rest comes in the enjoyment of each moment, enjoying everything around us and taking time to see it – enjoy it, studying each element. Psalm 8 commends us to “consider the works of your hand” to stand back and think on how this, our world and the universe around it, was created, crafted for our enjoyment, and for us to rule and reign over it – to tend it for God so that we can enjoy it together. Harvest is that time of appreciation of what God has done, what He has crafted and what He continues to do, faithfully, each year.

On a visit to a farm recently I was shown a barn full of grain. I asked how much grain there was and the reply was that there was around sixty tons! I then asked how much seed was sown and the reply was a few hundredweight. A miracle was in front of us – hundredweights turned into tons. What a faithful, abundant, generous and loving God we have, who wants to show us the works of **His** fingers and share **His** delight with us.

# Standing on the edge of something new

About four years ago at Spring Harvest I had a sense that God was saying, "You're standing on the edge of something new." I saw a lake stretched out with a shimmering horizon and I was standing on the edge of it. I spent a year praying and thinking, OK God, what is it? Then I felt God saying, well you won't know unless you put your feet into the water. So I signed up for The Course in Christian Studies. It was an amazing course that I thoroughly enjoyed and learnt so much.

This course ended in July this year and I said "Now what?" I had been on a Vocations day and attended a talk on Licensed Lay Ministry (LLM). I could see loads of reasons for not doing it.

I went on the Vocations day again in February this year. Bishop John talked about Good No's and Bad No's. The good No's were the ones that come from God – No, that's not right for you, I've got something better. The bad No's are the ones you say to God – No, I can't do that, I'm too busy, too old, too stupid etc.

As I looked at all the no's I had been saying, I realised that for every one God was saying "Yes, but ..." God was clearing the way for me to do it. For example, I do Beading Fairs and this usually takes out one Saturday every month and 14 Sundays a year. The Saturday beading has closed and the Sunday ones have reduced to 3 a year. None of it is my doing!

At a prayer meeting in March, I saw the lake again and this time I saw a boat with Jesus sitting in it holding His hand out for me to get in. This was confirmation that I should do the LLM training.

So here I am, back at college again, looking at three years of study. The term has started and it all feels very daunting at the moment. I would value your prayers, I know I have your love.

And if anybody has got a book on New Testament Greek ....
